

Dear Members of the Maine Board of Pesticides Control,

My name is **David Ayaya**, and I am writing to sincerely apologize for my actions regarding the use of **Sniper 1000EC DDVP** in a tenant's apartment.

First and foremost, I want to express my deepest regret for this incident. My intention was never to harm my tenants or put anyone's health or safety at risk. At the time, I was dealing with a significant cockroach and insect problem in my apartment building and was trying to address it as quickly as possible. I purchased the product from a store, and I genuinely did not know that it was not approved for residential use in Maine or that using it in that manner violated state and federal regulations.

As soon as I learned about the seriousness of the situation, I accepted responsibility for my actions. I fully cooperated with the Maine Board of Pesticides Control and followed the recommendations provided. I hired a professional cleaning company, and with the guidance of the State Toxicologist and the Board, I ensured that the apartment was thoroughly cleaned and properly ventilated before anyone was allowed to return. I am grateful that no one was injured or became ill as a result of this incident.

This experience has been a difficult lesson for me. I now understand the importance of following pesticide laws and using only approved products in accordance with their labels. I take full responsibility for my mistake and have taken steps to ensure that nothing like this will ever happen again.

I respectfully ask for your understanding and forgiveness. I deeply regret my actions and the concern they caused. Thank you for considering my apology and for giving me the opportunity to resolve this matter.
