

BIBLIOGRAPHY OF MAINE HERPETOLOGY

The third edition of *Maine Amphibians and Reptiles* (Hunter et al. 2025) included citations for nearly all published literature pertaining specifically to amphibians and reptiles in Maine. This nearly complete bibliography of Maine herpetology is reproduced here, with the addition of entries for each species account in *Maine Amphibians and Reptiles* and its predecessors (Hunter et al. 1992, 1999). However, some early (pre-1900) references compiled by Norton (no date), mostly of reports of species found by various naturalists, are not included here. Norton's bibliography is available at the University of Maine's Fogler Library in Orono. In addition, some unpublished ("gray") literature, such as agency reports, are missing, as are some graduate theses and dissertations.
