

## **Fishes**

Smallmouth bass Largemouth bass Yellow perch Chain pickerel Minnows Golden shiner Common shiner Hornpout (bullhead) Banded killifish Pumpkinseed sunfish American eel

## **Physical Characteristics**

Area - 30 acres

Temperatures:

Surface - 77°F

Maximum depth - 14 feet 20 feet - 76°F

Principal fisheries: Smallmouth bass and largemouth bass

Water quality in Dumpling Pond is considered very good for resident warmwater fisheries, however, the pond does not thermally stratify in the summer, providing no coldwater habitat for trout. Competition and predation from existing populations of warmwater fish further diminish the opportunity to manage for coldwater fish.

The MDIFW introduced smallmouth bass in 1960 and this introduction was successful in establishing a good bass fishery. Largemouth bass subsequently established as the result of an unauthorized illegal introduction.

Access is restricted to permissive trespass. There is a need to develop public boat access to this water.
