Largemouth bass were introduced into Perley Pond in 1966 and have now become established in sufficient numbers to provide good fishing. The shores are matted with heavy growths of aquatic plants that make ideal habitat for largemouth bass. The abundance of yellow perch and golden shiners provide and ample forage for the the bass and pickerel.

Perley Pond has a relatively large volume of cool, well oxygenated water which, in the absence of competition from warmwater sepcies, could support a trout population. However, the extensive marshy shorelines and lack of a suitable site on the outlet to locate a barrier dam preclude possible chemical reclamation.

Stocking with trout is not recommended. Management should include only those species already present.

There is no public access to this pond. Access is limited to carry-in off Sandy Beach Road.
