
Sand Pond, located west of Route 11 in
East Baldwin, is managed principally for
warmwater fish species. A lack of cool,
well-oxygenated water during the summer
months limits the opportunity for
coldwater fisheries management. The Maine
Department of Fisheries and Wildlife
stocks legal- size brook trout in the fall
to provide a winter and early spring
fishery.

Largemouth bass were introduced by this department in 1957. The introduction was successful, and an excellent fishery now exists. In 1969, artificial reefs were created using cement blocks and used tires. These reefs were successful in providing cover for juvenile bass and perch.

A town-owned access site, located on the west shore on the Sand Pond Road, provides access for small boats and canoes.
