Cow Pond is located east of Spotted Mountain The pond has no major inlets, but an outlet flows southeast into Greeley Pond The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Cow Pond is marginal for coldwater gamefish Water temperatures in this shallow pond reach critically high levels during the warm summer months. However, a small number of wild brook trout survive to allow for a limited fishery. Growth is good despite heavy competition from other species. The pond is not stocked.

Cow Pond is reached beyond the gate of the Kennebago Road off Routes 4 and 16. The pond is open to fishing with the use or possession of live fish as bait being prohibited in the summer and is closed to ice fishing.
