Midway Pond is located west of Saddleback Mountain. This high elevation pond has no inlet, but a small outlet flows south into Cascade Stream. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Midway Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. A fishery for brook trout is maintained through annual stockings because spawning and nursery habitats are lacking. Growth is good with no competition from other fish species.

Midway Pond is accessible via a series of trails leaving from the Saddleback Ski Area. The pond is open to fishing with the use of live fish as bait being prohibited in the summer months and is closed to ice fishing.
