

(Parkis Pond or Mirror Lake)

Physical Characteristics

Area - 102 acres Temperatures:

Surface - 77°F 22 feet - 56°F

Maximum depth - 26 feet

Principal fisheries: Largemouth bass, white perch, chain pickerel

Parker Pond is located north of Moose Hill. Two inlets enter the pond; James Brook at the north and an unnamed tributary at the south. The outlet, Little Norridgewock Stream, flows north into Wilson Stream. The shoreline is mostly undeveloped.

Water quality in Parker Pond is marginal for coldwater gamefish. Water temperatures reach critical levels during the warm summer months. Salmonid spawning and nursery habitat is limited, but landlocked salmon utilize the inlet to maintain low numbers. Bass, perch, and pickerel provide anglers with good opportunities year-round. The pond is not stocked.

Parker Pond is accessible via a gravel side road off the East Jay Road. The pond is open to fishing in both the summer and winter seasons under general law. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
