

Perry Pond is located northwest of Beech Hill in the southeast corner of Sandy River Plantation. There is no inlet, but its outlet flows southeast into the Sandy River. The shoreline of the pond is undeveloped.

Water quality in Perry Pond is good for coldwater gamefish, but there is no spawning habitat to naturally sustain a population. Brook trout are stocked annually to maintain a fishery and must compete with shiners and sunfish for food and space.

Perry Pond is reached from a trail accessed from a series of logging roads.
