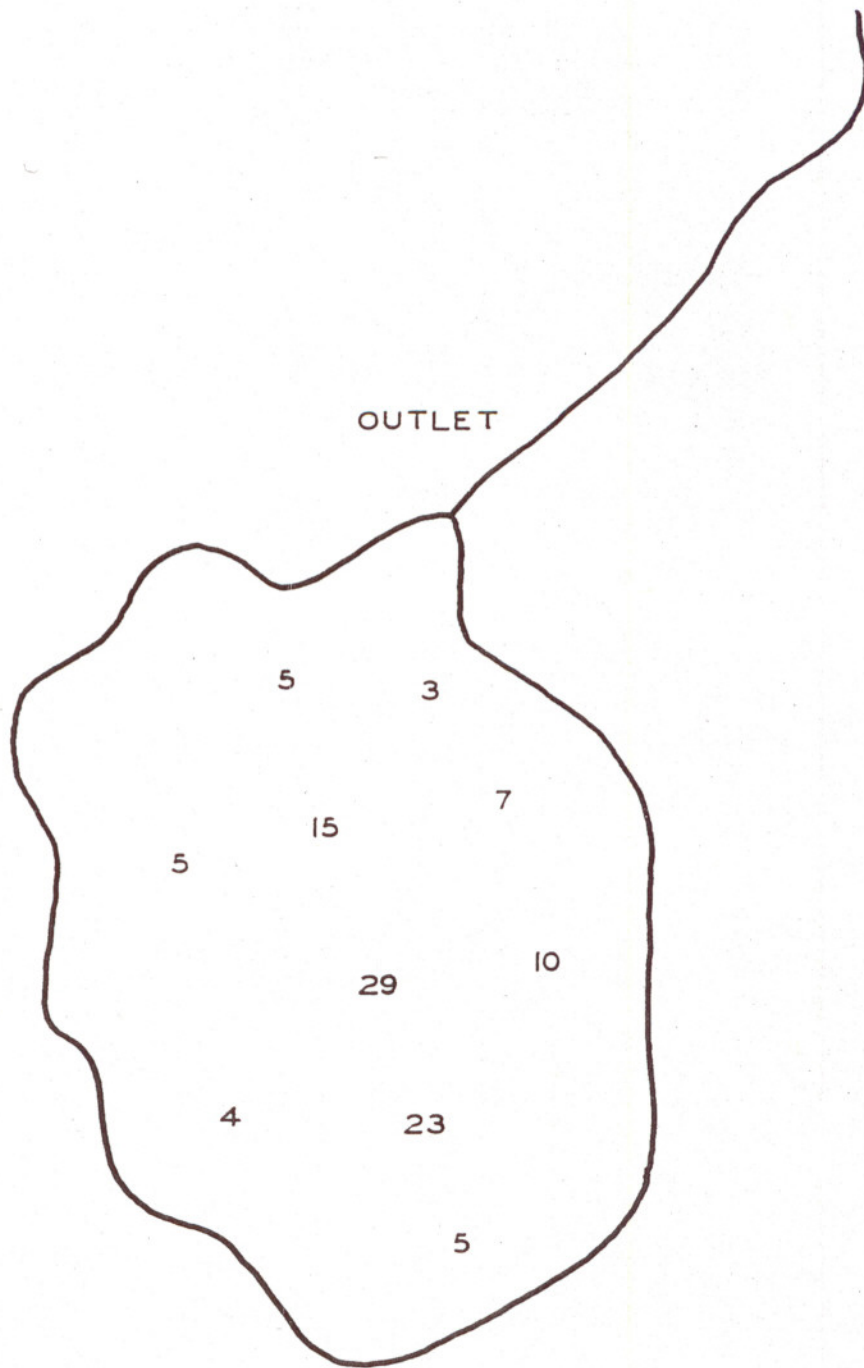
Principal fishery: Brook trout

South Pond or Pine Tree Pond is located in southern Sandy River Plantation. The Appalachian trail passes along its north shore. It has no inlet, but an outlet flows northeast into the Sandy River. The shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in South Pond is good for coldwater gamefish, but there is no suitable spawning habitat. Annual stockings of brook trout provide the fishery. Trout grow well due to the lack of competing species.

South Pond is reach by a foot trail from Route 4. The pond is open to fishing with the use or possession of live fish as bait being prohibited.
