

Upper Lead Mountain Pond is located several miles north of Route 9 (the "Airline"). Access is over Champion International gravel roads. A public boat launching site in fair condition is available along the southeastern shore.

The pond provides acceptable water quality for salmon. Although smelts appear to be reasonably abundant based on annual spring spawning runs up several tributaries, salmon growth rate is generally below average. Most angled salmon range in length from 14 1/2- 16 inches. An every other year stocking regimen has recently been implemented in an effort to increase the numbers of medium-size salmon. With one exception, the tributaries are closed to the taking of smelts.

White perch provide a fair fishery in the summer. Those anglers familiar with the location of the "perch holes" make good catches of 10-12 inch perch on some days. A limited fishery for 8-10 inch brook trout exists in the winter and spring.
