

Principal fishery: Brook trout

Ross Pond has been managed successfully for brook trout for many years. Annual stocking of legal-sized brook trout is necessary because suitable spawning and nursery areas in the pond are lacking. These annual spring stockings provide for a very popular fishery and should be continued.

The outlet of Ross Pond flows into Boyd Pond and the Pemaquid River where brown trout are established. Therefore, it is not unlikely that a few browns have migrated into Ross Pond. Occasionally, a large brown trout may be caught by a lucky angler.
