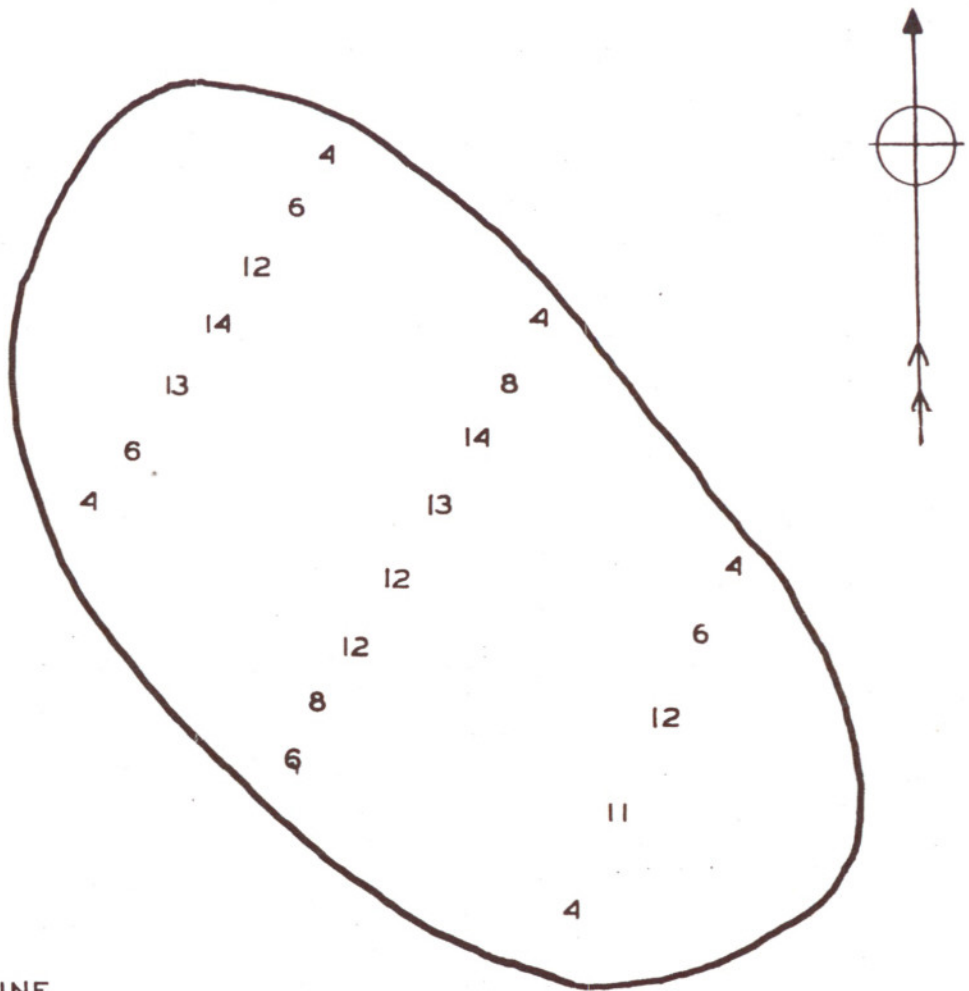
Round Pond, a small “kettle hole” located immediately west of Routes 113 and 5 in Fryeburg, was chemically reclaimed in 1971 to eliminate competing fish species and permit more intensive management for brook trout. The reclamation was only partially successful, eliminating chain pickerel and pumpkinseed sunfish, but failing to eliminate the hornpout. Since then the pond has been stocked each spring with brook trout and provides a popular spring fishery.

Access is restricted to permissive trespass along a dirt road off the Porter Road.
