Green Mountain Pond is a small, relatively deep pond with crystal clear water. Brook trout were reported present in the past but no fish were taken in the survey. Although an oxygen deficiency exists. below 18 feet, there is sufficient cool, well-oxygenated water above this level to support trout during critical summer periods. Aquatic insects are abundant.

Only one small, cool spring trickle was found entering the pond. The outlet drops very rapidly below the pond and is impassable to upstream fish movement. It was dry when surveyed.

Access to Green Mountain Pond is by 4-wheel-drive vehicle and a 100 yard walk through the woods.

Brook trout were stocked in the fall of 1970 and periodic stocking may be necessary to maintain the fishery. A "No Live Fish as Bait" regulation is recommended to prevent introduction of competing species.
