Jerry Pond has similar water temperatures at all depths. Trout seek cool spring areas and stream tributaries when pond temperatures become too warm.

The pond supports a fairly good population of brook trout despite the abundance of suckers, minnows, sunfish, and horn-pout that compete with trout for food and space. These fish are undoubtedly reducing the trout population to some extent.

Natural spawning of trout appears adequate to maintain the fishery.
