Little Benson is a beautiful pond bordered by hardwoods intermixed with a few large pines.

Analysis of water quality at the time of the survey indicated an oxygen deficiency below depths of 20 feet. However, there is sufficient cool, oxygenated water above 20 feet to support brook trout.

Brook trout presently in the pond are wild fish. Access to spawning grounds in the inlet and outlet brooks is blocked by beaver dams. The trout population is probably reproducing in the pond itself. Trout growth is below the statewide average for lakes and ponds probably because of competition from rough fish.

Use and possession of live fish as bait should be prohibited to prevent further deterioration of the fishery from competition of undesirable species.

Little Benson Pond is reached by foot trail off a gravel road suitable for automobiles after spring.
