
Peaked Mountain Pond is very productive and supports a good trout population. The pond water temperature remains nearly the same from surface to bottom throughout the summer. Trout seek the cool water of several springs during the critical summer periods when the pond water becomes too warm for survival. During the periods when the pond water is cool, trout feed actively on the abundant aquatic insect fauna.


Natural reproduction in spring areas of the pond maintains the wild brook trout fishery.

Access to Peaked Mountain Pond is via private gravel roads built and maintained by industrial landowners for forest management purposes. A hand carry landing exists at the North Maine Woods campsite located at the east end of the pond.
