Trues Pond is a shallow impoundment formed on the St. George River by a dam in South Montville. Small watercraft can be launched at the dam or off Route 173 at the pond's north end.

Pickerel fishing is the chief attraction and is enjoyed by many ice and open-water anglers. Smallmouth bass and largemouth bass are also present. Largemouths are relatively new to Trues Pond, having migrated there from St.George Lake.
