


Goulding Lake is a small water located in eastern Washington County. Access is via a dirt road maintained by the town of Robbinston. A suitable area is present to launch a canoe/small boat.

The lake provides a satisfactory trout fishery which is maintained through annual stockings of fall fingerlings. Age I+ fish from 8-10 inches provide the bulk of the fishery, but some Age II+ fish from 12-15 inches are caught each year. Because this lake receives light-moderate use in the open water season, it is open to ice fishing. Surveyed- August, 1961 (Revised, 1973, 1995) Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife
