

East Pike Brook Pond is located on the blueberry barrens of Washington County. Consult a topographic map for directions. A dirt road passes close to the pond and a canoe/small boat can be slid down a fairly steep bank.

This pond formerly provided a satisfactory trout fishery in most years based on an annual fall fingerling stocking program. However, investigative work in the late 1980's revealed that survival of trout beyond age I+ was minimal. Summer bottom temperatures were too warm for trout, and this compromised

their survival. Accordingly, the regular stocking program was terminated in 1987. Because trout can survive here well into June, the pond receives occasional stockings of fall fingerlings when surplus fish are available.
