Sam Hill Lake is a warmwater game fish lake. The great majority of the cold water present is deficient in dissolved oxygen, and thus unsuitable for brook trout.

Access to the pond is via an unimproved dirt road off Route 9. A canoe or small boat can be launchd without too much difficulty at the bridge on the outlet.

The pond lies in a wilderness setting. For those who enjoy snowmobiling in to such a location and ice fishing for pickerel, Sam Hill Lake affords an excellent opportunity.
