

Unnamed Pond (locally known as Berrypatch Pond) is a tiny pond located in the southeastern corner of T31 MD. To get there from Route 9 (the "Airline"), travel south about 2 miles on the dirt road just west of Old Stream, then take a woods road on the left. You can drive right to the pond. The pond is stocked annually and produces a good fishery for brook trout. Sunfish are numerous, but very small. They have been found in stomachs of larger trout which have occasionally reached lengths of 18 inches in this pond.

It is important that no additional competitor species gain entry to this small pond since they would adversely affect trout growth.
