Unnamed Pond is a tiny kettle pond (no inlet or outlet) located just west of the Machias River CCC Road between the West Branch of the Machias River and the so-called "Stud Mill Road".

The original survey indicated that no fish inhabited this pond, although water quality was considered adequate for trout. Fall fingerling trout were stocked for a while, but returns to the angler did not justify continued stockings. The pond is highly acidic (ph=5.0), and this may have limited trout production either directly or indirectly through reductions in food availability. The few trout reported from this pond in recent years probably originated from nearby waters and were stocked illegally.

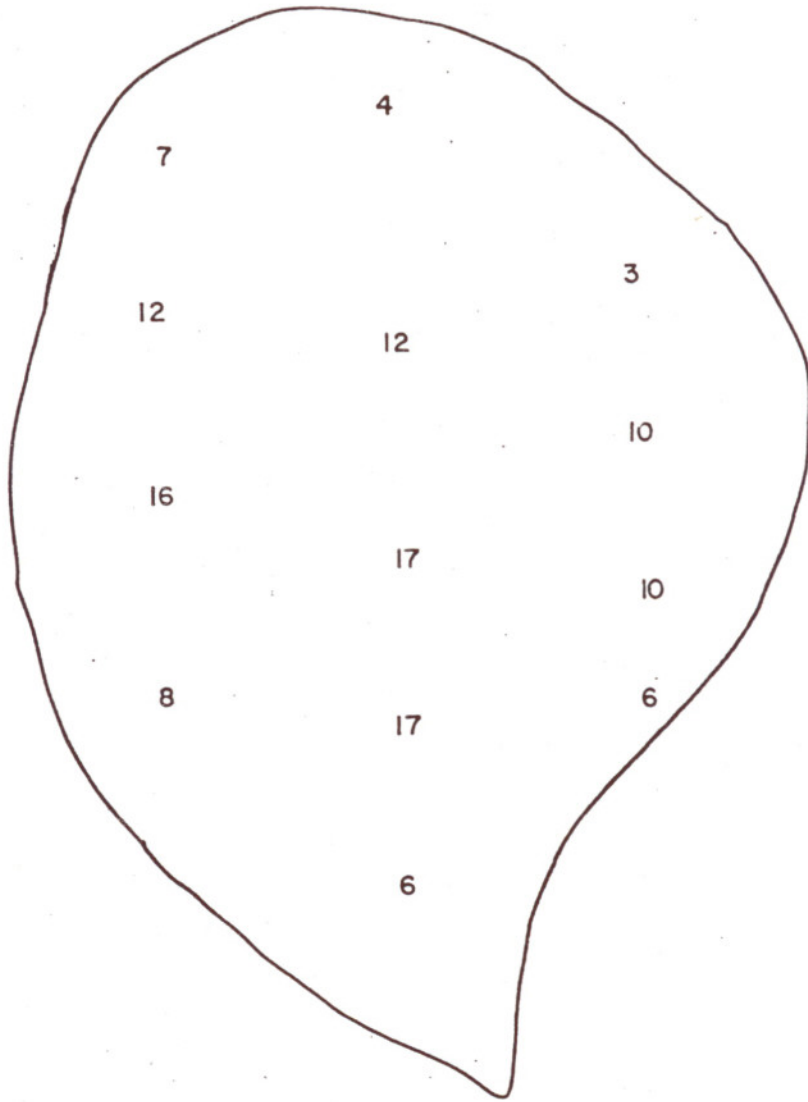
