

Tote Road Pond was successfully reclaimed in 1991 to eradicate white sucker and other competitor species. Only redbelly dace have become re-established since reclamation. A large population of brook trout is being maintained by annual stocking of fingerling trout. Some natural reproduction of brook trout is occurring within spring areas of the pond. These spring areas also serve as a summer refuge from high water temperatures and are allowing some trout to survive several years and growth up to 16 inches in length.

Conservative fishery regulations have been implemented to maintain and enhance sport fishing opportunity.

Two-wheel-drive access to Tote Road Pond is via improved private gravel roads maintained by industrial landowners for forest management purposes.
