

Little Medomak Pond has been successfully managed for brown trout since the initial stocking in 1959. Annual stocking is necessary due to the lack of suitable spawning and nursery habitat for coldwater species.

Historically, brook trout were stocked in an attempt to provide a fishery but because of marginal water quality and large numbers of competing species the program was abandoned. An occasional brook trout may migrate upstream into the pond from the Medomak River.


A public unimproved boat launch site is located on the northwest shore.
