
Principal Fishery: Brook trout

Little Concord Pond is located in the mountains south of Rumford. Cold, well-oxygenated water down to 30 feet provides excellent brook trout habitat. Smelts provide the principal forage for the larger trout. Pickerel and sunfish compete with the trout, but the pond's deep shoreline limit the warmwater habitat. Brook trout are stocked annually because spawning habitat is very limited.

Special regulations are in effect on this pond to provide a quality fishery. Anglers should consult their lawbooks before fishing this pond.

Access is limited to walk-in or 4-wheel drive from the Shagg Pond Road.
