
Principal fishery: Landlocked salmon and brook trout

Parmachenee Lake is located north of Aziscohos Lake. It's main inlet and outlet, the Magalloway River, enters the north end of the lake and exits the south side flowing into Aziscohos Lake. The lake's shoreline is partly developed.

Water quality in Parmachenee Lake is good for coldwater gamefish. Ample spawning and nursery habitat allows salmon and brook trout to naturally reproduce and maintain fisheries. Salmonid growth is good despite competition from minnows and suckers. The lake is not stocked.

Parmachenee Lake is accessible via private gated roads north of Route 16. The lake is open to fly casting and fly trolling only in the summer months and closed to ice fishing. See the lawbook for special regulations.
