Physical Characteristics

Area - 40 acres

Principal fisheries: Largemouth bass, chain pickerel

Pickerel Pond is relatively shallow water, which is best suited for warmwater fish species. The pond's undeveloped shorelines offer a quiet, remote setting for angling.

In 1960, MDIFW introduced largemouth bass to improve fishing opportunities on the pond. The bass have established and provide good fishing. Pickerel and perch are also readily caught and provide some variety for the angler.

Access is via permissive trespass off an old jeep trail that parallels the western shore of the pond.
