Principal Fishery: Smallmouth bass, yellow perch, chain pickerel

Seboeis Lake is exceptionally good habitat for warmwater game fishes. The lake presently supports a large pickerel population.

The extensive gravel shoals and rocky shoreline provide ideal resident, spawning, and nursery areas for smallmouth bass. The natural food supply for bass is excellent. There is little danger of migration to adjoining trout waters because of the presence of natural falls that are impassable to upstream migration.

Mature adults were stocked in 1958, '59, '60 and have reproduced successfully. Bass are now a supplement to the excellent pickerel fishery.

Seboeis Lake should remain open to ice fishing under present regulations.
