Little Indian Pond is a shallow, weedy pond located at the headwaters of the Sebasticook River drainage. Ideal habitat exists for warmwater fish species. Little Indian Pond is connected by a short stream to the larger Big Indian Pond.

Smallmouth bass were introduced to Big Indian Pond in the early 1970's and emigrated shortly thereafter to Little


Indian Pond. Largemouth bass became established and confirmed in the early 1990's. Black crappie have also become established. These species now provide excellent sport fisheries.

An access site for hand carried watercraft is located on the outlet along State Route 23.
