

Ripley Pond is a shallow, weedy pond ideally suited for warmwater fishery management. Habitat conditions are particularly favorable for largemouth bass. Largemouths were introduced by the Department in 1979. Subsequent surveys show this species has become well established. White perch and pickerel are also abundant and provide plenty of fishing opportunity for both winter and summer anglers.

Ripley Pond can be accessed from a small launch located off the North Road.


