
Principal Fishery: Chain pickerel, yellow perch

Orange Lake is located close to Route 1 in Whiting. Access is via a gravel camp road. No public boat launching area is present.

Pickerel were illegally introduced around 1990. This careless act served to further diminish the already limited fishery for wild brook trout. The pickerel have grown rapidly, as is customary for newly introduced species. Anglers have caught fish up to 4 pounds.

Yellow perch are abundant, and some grow to the attractive 9-11 inch range. Anglers catch an occasional brown trout which has dropped down from Rocky Lake.
