

Rocky Pond has very clear water with an attractive sandy shoreline. It has no inlet or outlet, and relies on ground water inflow for its water supply. Such ponds are referred to as “kettle holes,” and were formed from large pieces of ice breaking off glaciers, making depressions, and then filling with water from melting ice and springs.

When surveyed in the summer of 1959 the pond appeared to be fishless. The ponds' water quality (shallow and homothermous) precludes the possibility of any trout stocking.
