INTRODUCTION

This document is a Consent Agreement regarding Lloyd R. Campbell's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Maine. This Consent Agreement is pursuant to 32 M.R.S.A. § 2105-A(1-A) and 10 M.R.S.A. § 8003(5). The parties to this Consent Agreement are Lloyd R. Campbell, the Maine State Board of Nursing ("the Board") and the Department of Attorney General, State of Maine.

Following an informal conference held on February 5, 1997, Lloyd R. Campbell entered into a Consent Agreement for voluntary surrender of his license. That Consent Agreement, which became effective on April 25, 1997, conditioned the reinstatement of Mr. Campbell's license on the fulfillment of certain specified conditions during the period of surrender. The agreement provided that after one year from its effective date, Mr. Campbell could petition the Board for reinstatement of his license on probationary status.

Mr. Campbell submitted a written request for reinstatement of license following the minimum one year period of surrender. The parties met to discuss his request at a meeting held on June 11, 1998. As a result of that meeting, the parties agreed to enter into this Consent Agreement allowing for a reinstatement on probation with conditions of Mr. Campbell's license.

REINSTATEMENT WITH CONDITIONS OF PROBATION

Mr. Campbell's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Maine is reinstated on a probationary status. The period of probation will commence upon Mr. Campbell's return to nursing practice, either through employment or pursuant to an educational program. The period of probation will continue for a minimum of 24 months of nursing practice and until such time as the Board agrees to terminate probation upon written request of Mr. Campbell. Mr. Campbell's probationary license is subject to the following conditions:

1. <u>Substance Free</u>: Mr. Campbell will abstain completely from the use of alcohol or drugs, with the exception of substances used in accordance with a valid prescription from a physician who is aware of Mr. Campbell's substance abuse history.



- 2. <u>Aftercare</u>: Mr. Campbell will continue in his treatment program for as long as deemed appropriate by his counselor.
- 3. <u>Counselor's Quarterly Reports</u>: Mr. Campbell will arrange for and ensure the submission of quarterly reports from his counselor.
- 4. Notice of Employment/Nursing Practice Status: Mr. Campbell will immediately notify the Board in writing should he return to employment or an educational program in the field of nursing. Notice under this section shall include the place and position of employment or the educational program and any change in employment or educational programs.
- 5. Notice to Employer/Instructor: Mr. Campbell will notify any and all of his nursing employers or notify faculty involved in any clinical studies of the terms of this Consent Agreement and shall provide them with a copy of it. For purposes of this Consent Agreement, nursing employment is any employment during which Mr. Campbell performs nursing service or holds himself out as a nurse, such as through the designation "R.N."
- 6. <u>Employer/Clinical Faculty Quarterly Reports</u>: Mr. Campbell will arrange for and ensure the submission to the Board of quarterly reports from his nursing employer or clinical faculty.
- 7. Confidentiality and Release of Records: Mr. Campbell agrees and understands that the Board and the Department of Attorney General shall have access to any and all medical records and all otherwise confidential or medically privileged information pertaining to his treatment for substance abuse which the Board deems necessary to evaluate Mr. Campbell's compliance with his Consent Agreement and his continued recovery. Mr. Campbell shall provide such information, shall authorize the release of such records and information, and shall authorize any such discussions and communications with any and all persons involved in his care, counseling and employment as may be requested by the Board for the purpose of evaluating Mr. Campbell's compliance with this Consent Agreement and his continued recovery.
- 8. Automatic Suspension: Mr. Campbell agrees and understands that if any member of the Board or the Board's Executive Director receives reasonably reliable information suggesting that Mr. Campbell has not remained substance free in accordance with this Consent Agreement, Mr. Campbell's license will be immediately and automatically suspended pending further review by the Board. In the event such information is received by any member of the Board or its Executive Director, the information will be forwarded to Mr. Campbell for a response. Mr. Campbell agrees and understands that his license shall remain suspended unless and until the Board is satisfied that Mr. Campbell's license may be reinstated consistent with the public health and welfare in the area of nursing service.

- 9. <u>Term of Probationary Status</u>: Mr. Campbell agrees and understands that his license will remain on probationary status and subject to the terms of this agreement indefinitely beyond the 24 month probationary period of nursing practice, until and unless the Board, at Mr. Campbell's written request, votes to terminate Mr. Campbell's probation. When considering whether to terminate the probation, the Board will consider the degree to which Mr. Campbell has complied with the provisions of this agreement.
- 10. <u>Miscellaneous Provisions</u>: This Consent Agreement modifies and replaces the 1997 Consent Agreement entered into by and between Mr. Campbell, the Board and Department of Attorney General. Mr. Campbell understands that this document is a Consent Agreement which affects his rights to practice nursing in Maine. This Consent Agreement may be amended only in writing signed by all the parties. Mr. Campbell understands that he does not have to execute this Consent Agreement and that he has the right to consult with an attorney before entering this Consent Agreement. Mr. Campbell affirms that he executes this Consent Agreement of his own free will.
- 11. <u>Effective Date</u>: This Consent Agreement becomes effective upon the last necessary signature below.
