**INTRODUCTION**

This document is a Consent Agreement (“Agreement”) regarding Mary Eva Laskey Franklin’s license to practice registered professional nursing in the State of Maine. The parties enter into this Agreement pursuant to 10 M.R.S.A. § 8003(5), (A-1) (4) and 10 M.R.S.A. § 8003(5) (B). The parties to this Agreement are Mary Eva Laskey Franklin (“Ms. Franklin” or “Applicant”), Maine State Board of Nursing (“Board”) and the Office of the Attorney General, State of Maine. On September 4, 2008, the Board considered Mary Eva Laskey Franklin’s application for licensure as a registered professional nurse by endorsement.

**FACTS**

1. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin filed an application for licensure as a registered professional nurse by endorsement with the Maine State Board of Nursing on July 28, 2008.
2. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin graduated with diploma in May 1987 from St. John’s College, Springfield, Illinois. Her current license (License No. 676447) as a registered professional nurse in Texas will expire September, 2008.
3. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin disclosed on her Maine application that she was disciplined in Texas for practicing beyond scope and falsifying records/reports. The discipline in Texas resulted in a Reprimand, a fine of \$1000 and a probationary license [Exhibit A].
4. On September 4, 2008, the Board voted to approve Ms. Franklin’s application for endorsement and to place her license on probation for a period of two years.

**AGREEMENT WITH CONDITIONS OF PROBATION**

5. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin agrees and understands that based upon the above-stated facts this document imposes discipline regarding her license to practice registered professional nursing.
6. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin’s license as a registered professional nursing in the State of Maine is placed on probationary status with conditions. The period of probation will commence upon Ms. Franklin’s return to nursing practice, either through employment



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and/or pursuant to a clinical nursing educational program. The period of probation will be for two years, effective only while she is employed in nursing practice and/or enrolled in a clinical nursing education program. For purposes of this Agreement, nursing employment is any employment during which Ms. Franklin performs nursing services. Ms. Franklin's probationary license will be subject to the following conditions:

- a. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin shall fully comply with the conditions of probation in the Texas Order, within the times specified, and in this Agreement and cooperate with the representatives of the Board in its monitoring and investigation of the Applicant's compliance with probation. Ms. Franklin shall inform the Board in writing within 15 days of any address change.
- b. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin will notify the Board in writing within five business days after she obtains any nursing employment and/or an educational program in the field of nursing. Notice under this section shall include the place and position of employment or the nursing educational program. If during the period of probation, Ms. Franklin's employment as a nurse or her educational program in the field of nursing terminates, she shall notify the Board in writing within five business days after she is terminated or separated, regardless of cause, from any nursing employment or nursing educational program with a full explanation of the circumstances surrounding the termination or separation.
- c. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin will notify any and all of her nursing employers and faculty involved in any clinical studies of the terms of this Consent Agreement and shall provide them with a copy of it.
- d. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin will arrange for and ensure the submission to the Board of quarterly reports from her nursing employer and/or clinical faculty regarding her general nursing practice, which is to include clinical competency, ability to follow policies/procedures relative to standards of practice, and clinical documentation.
- e. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin agrees and understands that her license will remain on probationary status and subject to the terms of this Agreement beyond the two-year probationary period until and unless the Board, at Ms. Franklin's written request, votes to terminate her probation. When considering whether to terminate the probation, the Board will consider the extent to which she has complied with the provisions of this Agreement.
- f. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin's employment is restricted during the period of probation to structured settings with on-site supervision by another registered professional nurse. Structured settings shall not include assignments from temporary employment agencies, school nursing, work as a traveling nurse or within the correctional system.

7. If Ms. Franklin violates the conditions of her probation, the Board will give written notice to the Applicant regarding her failure to comply. Notice will be sent (certified mail, return receipt requested) to the last known address of the Applicant that is on file with the Board. The Applicant has 30 days from receipt of this notification to respond to the Board, in writing, regarding the alleged violation. The Board will review the Applicant's timely response to determine what action, if any, the Board determines to take. If the Applicant fails to timely respond to the Board's notification regarding her failure to comply, her license will be immediately suspended pending a hearing at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting. If after notice and a hearing, the Board finds that the Applicant has failed to meet the conditions of probation, the Board may take any disciplinary action which it deems appropriate and impose any of the sanctions including, but not limited to, that found in Title 10 M.R.S.A. § 8003 and Title 32 M.R.S.A. § 2105-A.
8. The State of Maine is a "party state" that has adopted the Nurse Licensure Compact ("Compact"), which is set out in Chapter 11 of the Rules and Regulations of the Maine State Board of Nursing. The State of Maine is Ms. Franklin's "home state" of licensure and primary state of residence, which means that she has declared the State of Maine as her fixed permanent and principle home for legal purposes; her domicile. Other party states that are in the Compact are referred to as "remote states," which means party states other than the home state that have adopted the Compact. Ms. Franklin understands that this document is an Agreement that is subject to the Compact. She agrees that during the pendency of this Agreement her nursing practice may be limited to the State of Maine as it pertains to the Compact. If Ms. Franklin wishes to practice in any other party state within the Compact, she shall arrange to have the party state in which she intends to practice provide the Board with written authorization that she has been approved to practice in that state.
9. This Agreement is a public record within the meaning of 1 M.R.S.A. § 402 and will be available for inspection and copying by the public pursuant to 1 M.R.S.A. § 408.
10. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin understands that she does not have to execute this Consent Agreement and has the right to consult with an attorney before entering into the Agreement.
11. Mary Eva Laskey Franklin affirms that she executes this Consent Agreement of her own free will.
12. Modification of this Consent Agreement must be in writing and signed by all parties.
13. This Consent Agreement is not subject to review or appeal by the Applicant, but may be enforced by an action in the Superior Court.
14. This Consent Agreement becomes effective upon the date of the last necessary signature below.

I, MARY EVA LASKEY FRANKLIN, HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THE FOREGOING CONSENT AGREEMENT. I UNDERSTAND THE EFFECT IT WILL HAVE ON MY REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE LICENSE. I UNDERSTAND THAT BY SIGNING IT, I WAIVE CERTAIN RIGHTS. I SIGN IT VOLUNTARILY, KNOWINGLY, AND INTELLIGENTLY AND AGREE TO BE BOUND BY THIS AGREEMENT. I UNDERSTAND THAT THIS CONSENT AGREEMENT CONTAINS THE ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND THERE IS NO OTHER AGREEMENT OF ANY KIND.

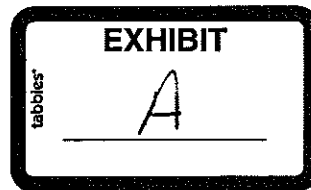

On this day the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the Board, considered the matter of MARY EVA FRANKLIN, Registered Nurse License Number 676447, hereinafter referred to as Respondent.

Information received by the Board produced evidence that Respondent may have violated Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal conference, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order offered on February 18, 2008, by Katherine A. Thomas, MN, RN, Executive Director, subject to ratification by the Board.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Prior to the institution of Agency proceedings, notice of the matters specified below in these Findings of Fact was served on Respondent and Respondent was given an opportunity to show compliance with all requirements of the law for retention of the license.
2. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal conference, notice and hearing, and agreed to the entry of this Order.
3. Respondent is currently licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.
4. Respondent received a Diploma in Nursing from St. John's Hospital School of Nursing, Springfield, Illinois, on May 1, 1987. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on March 19, 2001.

6. At the time of the initial incident, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with Mainland Medical Center, Texas City, Texas, and had been in this position for approximately five (5) months.
7. On or about August 25, 2006, while employed with Mainland Medical Center, Texas City, Texas, Respondent exceeded her scope of practice, as specified by the Texas Board of Nursing, in that she independently managed medical aspects of patient care in the induction of labor and spontaneous vaginal delivery of an infant to Patient Medical Record Number E000416957. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the patient in that it may have unnecessarily exposed them to risk of harm.
8. On or about August 26, 2006, while employed with Mainland Medical Center, Texas City, Texas, Respondent exceeded her scope of practice, as specified by the Texas Board of Nursing, in that she independently managed medical aspects of patient care in the induction of labor and spontaneous vaginal delivery of an infant to Patient Medical Record Number E000410766. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the patient in that it may have unnecessarily exposed them to risk of harm.
9. On or about September 1, 2006, while employed with Mainland Medical Center, Texas City, Texas, Respondent exceeded her scope of practice, as specified by the Texas Board of Nursing, in that she independently managed medical aspects of patient care in the induction of labor and spontaneous vaginal delivery of an infant to Patient Medical Record Number E000408737. Respondent's conduct was likely to injure the patient in that it may have unnecessarily exposed them to risk of harm.



10. On or about August 25 and 26, 2006 and September 1, 2006, while employed with Mainland Medical Center, Texas City, Texas, Respondent falsely documented that the physician was present during the delivery of an infant to Patient Medical Record Numbers E000416957, E000410766 and E000408737. Respondent's conduct resulted in an inaccurate medical record.
11. In Response to Findings of Fact Numbers Seven (7), Eight (8) and Nine (9), Respondent states:

"There are many times physicians don't make the deliveries. For the above patients in question, they were all multiparous clients and went very fast. I notified Dr. Wengroff that his patients were complete on all but the last delivery as when I answered her call light the baby was on the perineum. Two nurses entered the room to help me. One set up the delivery and he had told me he was on the west side of town for a meeting so I knew he would not make it in time for her delivery. I was told by him to call early as she would probably go fast but she went faster than we thought she would. One of the nurses offered to call him but I needed the warmer set up in case I had any trouble with the baby so I had her do that instead. After the delivery, I called Dr. Wengroff and he stated he would be in to see her but it would be a little while. I never discussed with Dr. Wengroff that I would do his deliveries for him. I would not take on that responsibility. I am a nurse not an MD. He and I were speaking at the desk regarding his residency experiences and I think that is where all the gossip came from."

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violations of Section 301.452(b)(10)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(A)(B)(D)&(3) and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A)(B)(C), (3)(4)&(6)(A)(H).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.452(b), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 676447, heretofore issued to MARYEVA FRANKLIN, including revocation of Respondent's license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

#### ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED and ORDERED, subject to ratification by the Texas Board of Nursing, that RESPONDENT SHALL receive the sanction of a REPRIMAND WITH

STIPULATIONS, and RESPONDENT SHALL comply in all respects with the Nursing Practice Act, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas as amended, Texas Occupations Code, §§301.001 *et seq.*, the Rules and Regulations Relating to Nurse Education, Licensure and Practice, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §211.01 *et seq.* and this Order.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's multistate licensure privilege, if any, to practice professional nursing in compact states.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that while Respondent's license is encumbered by this Order, Respondent may not work outside the State of Texas pursuant to a multistate licensure privilege without the written permission of the Texas Board of Nursing and the Board of Nursing in the party state where Respondent wishes to work.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that:

(1) RESPONDENT SHALL deliver the wallet-sized license issued to MARY EVA FRANKLIN, to the office of the Texas Board of Nursing within ten (10) days from the date of ratification of this Order for appropriate notation.

(2) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of entry of this Order, successfully complete a course in Texas nursing jurisprudence and ethics. RESPONDENT SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include nurses. It shall be a minimum of six (6) contact hours in length. The course's content shall include the Nursing Practice Act, standards of practice, documentation of care, principles of nursing ethics, confidentiality, professional boundaries, and the Board's Disciplinary Sanction Policies regarding Sexual Misconduct, Fraud, Theft and Deception,

Nurses with Chemical Dependency, and Lying and Falsification. Courses focusing on malpractice issues will not be accepted. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE the sponsoring institution to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Office of the Board to verify RESPONDENT's successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure. *Board-approved courses may be found at the following Board website address: <http://www.bon.state.tx.us/disciplinary action>.*

(3) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of entry of this Order, successfully complete a course in nursing documentation. RESPONDENT SHALL obtain Board approval of the course prior to enrollment only if the course is not being offered by a pre-approved provider. Home study courses and video programs will not be approved. The course shall be a minimum of six (6) hours in length of classroom time. In order for the course to be approved, the target audience shall include Nurses. The course shall include content on the following: nursing standards related to accurate and complete documentation; legal guidelines for recording; methods and processes of recording; methods of alternative record-keeping; and computerized documentation. RESPONDENT SHALL cause the instructor to submit a Verification of Course Completion form, provided by the Board, to the Board's office to verify RESPONDENT's successful completion of the course. This course shall be taken in addition to any other courses stipulated in this Order, if any, and in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board has for relicensure. *Board-approved courses may be found at the following Board website address: <http://www.bon.state.tx.us/disciplinary action>.*

(4) RESPONDENT SHALL, within one (1) year of entry of this Order, successfully complete the course "Sharpening Critical Thinking Skills," a 3.6 contact hour online program

provided by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Learning Extension. In order to receive credit for completion of this program, RESPONDENT SHALL SUBMIT the continuing education certificate of completion for this program to the Board's office, to the attention of Monitoring. This course is to be taken in addition to any continuing education requirements the Board may have for relicensure. *Information regarding*

(5) RESPONDENT SHALL pay a monetary fine in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1000). RESPONDENT SHALL pay this fine within ninety (90) days of entry of this Order. Payment is to be made directly to the Texas Board of Nursing in the form of cashier's check or U.S. money order. Partial payments will not be accepted.

**IT IS FURTHER AGREED, SHOULD RESPONDENT PRACTICE AS A REGISTERED NURSE IN THE STATE OF TEXAS, RESPONDENT WILL PROVIDE DIRECT PATIENT CARE AND PRACTICE IN A HOSPITAL, NURSING HOME, OR OTHER CLINICAL SETTING AND RESPONDENT MUST WORK IN SUCH SETTING A MINIMUM OF SIXTY-FOUR (64) HOURS PER MONTH UNDER THE FOLLOWING STIPULATIONS FOR TWO (2) YEARS OF EMPLOYMENT. THE LENGTH OF THE STIPULATION PERIOD WILL BE EXTENDED UNTIL SUCH TWENTY-FOUR (24) MONTHS HAVE ELAPSED. PERIODS OF UNEMPLOYMENT OR OF EMPLOYMENT THAT DO NOT REQUIRE THE USE OF A REGISTERED NURSE (RN) LICENSE WILL NOT APPLY TO THIS STIPULATION PERIOD:**

(6) RESPONDENT SHALL notify each present employer in nursing of this Order of the Board and the stipulations on RESPONDENT's license. RESPONDENT SHALL present a

complete copy of this Order and all Proposals for Decision issued by the Administrative Law Judge, if any, to each present employer within five (5) days of receipt of this Order. RESPONDENT SHALL notify all future employers in nursing of this Order of the Board and the stipulations on RESPONDENT's license. RESPONDENT SHALL present a complete copy of this Order and all Proposals for Decision issued by the Administrative Law Judge, if any, to each future employer prior to accepting an offer of employment.

(7) RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each present employer in nursing to submit the Notification of Employment form, which is provided to the Respondent by the Board, to the Board's office within ten (10) days of receipt of this Order. RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each future employer to submit the Notification of Employment form, which is provided to the Respondent by the Board, to the Board's office within five (5) days of employment as a nurse.

(8) RESPONDENT SHALL be supervised by a Registered Nurse who is on the premises. The supervising nurse is not required to be on the same unit or ward as RESPONDENT, but should be on the facility grounds and readily available to provide assistance and intervention if necessary. The supervising nurse shall have a minimum of two (2) years experience in the same or similar practice setting to which the Respondent is currently working. RESPONDENT SHALL work only regularly assigned, identified and predetermined unit(s). RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be employed by a nurse registry, temporary nurse employment agency, hospice, or home health agency. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT be self-employed or contract for services. Multiple employers are prohibited.

(9) RESPONDENT SHALL CAUSE each employer to submit, on forms provided to the Respondent by the Board, periodic reports as to RESPONDENT's capability to practice nursing. These reports shall be completed by the Registered Nurse who supervises the RESPONDENT. These reports shall be submitted by the supervising nurse to the office of the Board

at the end of each three (3) months for two (2) years of employment as a nurse.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED, that upon full compliance with the terms of this Order, RESPONDENT SHALL be issued an unencumbered license and multistate licensure privileges, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

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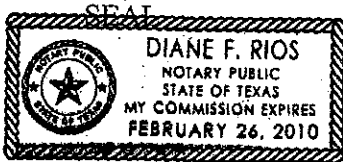
RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION

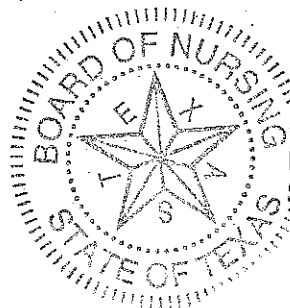
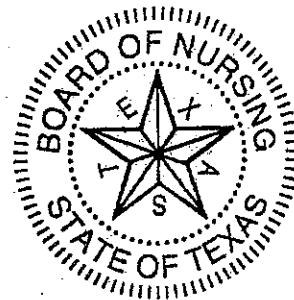
