Background information from Subdivision Review process, 2014-2016

The Maine Land Use Planning Commission has a process underway for reviewing and possibly revising parts of its rules governing residential subdivision development. This process has included extensive discussion and some materials and background information generated during the process may help inform the Commission's current review of the adjacency principle.
