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Summary

Terrence J. DeWan & Associates is in the process of seeking approvals for a wind energy project on Bull Hill in Bull Hill, Maine. Since this project may affect the view from Black Mountain and the Donnell Pond Unit, which are designated as scenic resources of state or national significance, the client wished to better understand public opinions of the possible effects of the project on that viewshed.

Terrence J. DeWan & Associates requested that the survey be conducted on Black Mountain, looking towards Bull Hill, over Columbus Day weekend 2010.

Terrence J. DeWan & Associates engaged Market Decisions to finalize and conduct the survey, and evaluate the results. Market Decisions interviewed 81 hikers during the survey.



Methodology

The survey used in this research was developed by Market Decisions. The survey was designed to be administered in person, on the top of Black Mountain, so it was purposefully short - just 27 questions, including demographic information.

For the most important set of questions, respondents at the top of Black Mountain were asked to rate the scenic value looking north (looking inland) and looking south (looking towards the ocean). Respondents were then asked to look at a photograph of the view from the southern end of Donnell Pond looking towards Bull Hill, and then to look at a photograph of the same view with simulated images of a turbines on Bull Hill. In addition, respondents were asked to look at a photograph of the view from the eastern peak of Black Mountain looking north towards Bull Hill, and then to look at a photograph of the same view with simulated images of turbines on Bull Hill.

The images presented were each approximately 9.5" by 19.5"; copies of these images are contained in the final section of this report.

The survey was administered on Saturday, October 9th, Sunday, October 10th and Monday, October 11th of Columbus Day Weekend, 2010. The weather was clear and mostly sunny on all three days, with minimal cloudiness but a great deal of wind. On each day, one trained interviewer was in the parking lot while one interviewer was at the top of Black Mountain. Interviewers conducted interviews from 10am – 4pm on Sunday, from 9am – 5:15pm on Saturday, and from 10am – 4:30pm on Monday. Interviewers intercepted people in the parking lot, as well as each party of hikers that appeared on the mountain. Multiple adults from each party were invited to participate as were willing. Children were not interviewed.

129 hikers, including adults (105) and children (24), were observed during the survey. In all, 81 interviews were completed among adult hikers that were hiking Black Mountain.

With such a high "response rate" (81 hikers interviewed of 105 adult hikers observed) we can say that the collected data is representative of the hikers on the mountain during the survey period. We cannot say whether the data would be the same for other days. Additional data would be necessary to make more definitive conclusions.




Visitor Traffic to Donnell Pond Unit




Previous Visits to Donnell Pond and Black Mountain

Q3: Have you visited the Donnell Pond Unit before today?



Q3a: About how many times in the past year (Among those who have visited Donnell Pond Unit before)













Q7a: About how many times in the past year? (Among those who have hike trails to Black Mountain before)






















Effect of Wind Power Project on Enjoyment and Likelihood of Returning

Most respondents (45%) indicated that their enjoyment of coming to Black Mountain would not be affected (rating of 4) by a change in the current views looking north from the east peak of Black Mountain compared to those with the proposed wind project. 4% stated the change in current views would have a very positive affect on their enjoyment (rating of 7) while 10% stated the change in current views would have a very negative affect on their enjoyment (rating of 1).

Looks just as good to me with our without mills; I'm glad to get out of bed and enjoy this in the morning.








Support for Commercial-Scale Wind Energy Development in Maine






