
Appendix B: Photographs and Photosimulations From All Viewpoints Within 8 Miles Of The Project From The Appalachian Trail In The Bigelow Preserve



SUMMARY OF VISIBILITY AND DISTANCES OF TURBINES LOCATED WITHIN 8 MILES OF VIEWPOINTS ALONG THE AT

The following table summarizes the visibility of the Project turbines located within 8 miles of each of the 20 viewpoints along the Appalachian Trail (AT) within the Bigelow Preserve. Distances in miles from the viewpoint to the nearest turbine(s) are also provided.

Of the 20 viewpoints, the Project would be visible from 8 of them, including either open, filtered, or heavily filtered views. Of the 39 turbines proposed for the Highland Wind Project, a maximum of 18 would be visible from any one viewpoint on the AT within 8 miles.






- 1 If any part of a turbine within 8 miles of a viewpoint is seen, the turbine is counted as visible.
- 2 At Viewpoint 9B, while the computer model indicates that 8± turbines within 8 miles may be visible, dense vegetation in the immediate foreground would prevent views of all but 4± turbines.
- 3 At Viewpoint 10, while the computer model indicates that up to 17 turbines within 8 miles may be visible, dense vegetation in the immediate foreground would prevent views of all but 9± turbines in most locations.
- 4 At Viewpoint 19, while the computer model indicates that 13± turbines within 8 miles may be visible, dense vegetation in the immediate foreground would prevent views of all but 7± turbines.

VIEWPOINT 1 (No turbines visible within 8 miles)

Description


Old Man's Head is a series of bald islands set among the spruce/fir forest at the top of a sheer rock face overlooking Little Bigelow Mountain. These rock outcrops occupy an area approximately 40' x 60'. The overlook is 300± feet south of the Appalachian Trail; a wooden sign on the AT directs hikers to "Old Man's Head, 0.1 miles, Excellent View." The sign is labeled M.A.T.C. (Maine Appalachian Trail Club).

The view from Old Man's Head comprises several components. The most open and prominent view is to the north, where the panorama extends from Flagstaff Lake on the northwest to Little Bigelow Mountain and Little Poplar Mountain on the southeast. Little Bigelow, with its steep southerly face, offers a dramatic counterpoint to the rolling hills and less prominent mountains to the south. The top of Stewart Mountain can be seen in the distance behind Little Bigelow. The view to the south toward Sugarloaf is secondary, since it is filtered by foreground evergreen trees and lacks the water features of the broader northerly view.

VIEWPOINT 2 (No turbines visible within 8 miles)

Description

A sign on the AT directs hikers to a viewpoint just off the trail. The view extends from the eastern end of Flagstaff Lake on the north to Little Bigelow Mountain on the east to Little Poplar Mountain on the southeast. The view is partially filtered by evergreen trees in the immediate foreground. Stewart Mountain is not visible from this viewpoint.

VIEWPOINT 3 (No view of Project)

Description

Another MATC sign on the AT directs hikers to a viewpoint 230'± off the trail. The view is primarily of Carrabassett Valley, focusing on the airport and the valley between Little Poplar Mountain on the east and the low hills on the west side of Route 27. The view is partially filtered by evergreen trees in the immediate foreground. The rock face of Old Man's Head blocks views toward Sugarloaf Mountain.

VIEWPOINT 3: Framed view below Old Man's Head looking south toward Sugarloaf Regional Airport in Carrabassett Valley. There will be no turbines visible within 8 miles of this viewpoint.



VIEWPOINT 4 (One turbine visible within 8 miles)

Description

From Old Man's Head going east, the final MATC viewpoint sign in the Bigelow Preserve for northbound hikers leads to Viewpoint 4, just off the trail. The steep south side of Little Bigelow Mountain is the focal point of this panoramic view, which extends from the southeastern tip of Flagstaff Lake (barely visible) to Sugarloaf Mountain. The open view of Little Bigelow extends over 40°, while evergreen trees in the foreground filter views to the north and south. The western end of Little Bigelow Mountain blocks views of Sugarloaf Regional Airport and Route 27.

One turbine will be visible within 8 miles from Viewpoint 4 at 7.93 miles. All others will be more than 8 miles away.



VIEWPOINT 4: Photosimulation of view toward Little Bigelow Mountain. One turbine would be 7.93 miles from this viewpoint; all others would be greater than 8 miles. Hold this image 21±" from eye to replicate actual view. If viewing on a computer screen, eye should be approximately 1.5 times the image width away from the screen. 

SEGMENT B: LITTLE BIGELOW MOUNTAIN RIDGE

The second segment of the AT within 8 miles of any turbine comprises the length of the Little Bigelow Mountain ridgeline, which runs in a general east-west orientation from Safford Brook to the eastern summit of the mountain. Most of the ridge trail is located in forestland, with limited views. Of the five viewpoints that were identified, the only view of the Project is from a point off the AT near the eastern peak of Little Bigelow Mountain (Viewpoint 9).

VIEWPOINT 5 (No view of Project)


Description

A small knoll at the top of the western peak of Little Bigelow Mountain affords a filtered view to the south. The view has four main points of interest: the southerly flank of Little Bigelow Mountain to the east; the broad valley west of Little Poplar Mountain to the southeast; Sugarloaf resort to the southwest; and Milton Avery Peak and Old Man's Head to the west. Views of the Project would be blocked by Little Bigelow Mountain.

This opening along the AT provides a southeasterly view of the pronounced undulating hills that comprise the Little Bigelow Mountain ridgeline, along with a filtered view of the eastern portion of Flagstaff Lake to the northeast. Views of the Project would be blocked by Little Bigelow Mountain.

Description


This is a dramatic panorama overlooking the south face of Little Bigelow Mountain, with full views of Sugarloaf Mountain and the high peaks of the Bigelow Range to the west. The viewer gets a good sense of the layered landscape to the west and south, with multiple ranges of mountains appearing as background 'waves'. Views of the Project would be blocked by Little Bigelow Mountain.




Description

VIEWPOINT 9

Description

Viewpoint 9 comprises four distinct observation points (see map on right and descriptions on following pages).

Point A is on the AT at the base of a 10±' high ledge on the south side of the path. There are no views from the trail. See p. 15.

Point B is at the top of the rock outcrop, requiring a hiker to leave the trail. Observations by Portland Research Group suggest that this is the primary destination point for people hiking Little Bigelow Mountain. From this observation point there are outstanding views with three major focal points: the high peaks of the Bigelow Range to the west, dominated by the sharp profile of Myron Avery Peak; the eastern end of Flagstaff Lake to the north; and the Sugarloaf Mountain resort to the southwest. Views to the southeast and east (toward Stewart Mountain and the Project) are almost entirely blocked by trees. There will be a highly filtered view of up to 8 turbines to the southeast. See pp. 16-18.

Point C is a secondary observation point below Point B and provides the first open view of the Project. The dominant views are west toward the high peaks and southwest toward Sugarloaf Mountain, rather than southeast toward the Project. Due to the drop in elevation, there is no view of Flagstaff Lake. 17 turbines within 8 miles will be visible. See pp. 19-20.


Point D is a lower ledge approximately 125' from Point B that affords the most open view of the Project. No hikers were observed by Portland Research Group venturing across the ledge to this lower observation point. 17 turbines within 8 miles will be visible. See pp. 21 - 23.

The view from Point D is naturally divided into four distinct components:


- The Bigelow Range to the west, including Cranberry Peak, The Horns, West Peak, and Myron Avery Peak. The view extends beyond the Bigelow Preserve to East Kennebago Mountain and other, more distant peaks to the west. This is the most dramatic and memorable of the components due to the angular profile of the Bigelow Range, the steepness of the terrain, the variety of landforms, and the general lack of cultural intrusions.
- Sugarloaf Mountain to the southwest, extending from Little Poplar Mountain on the east to Crocker Mountain on the west. This is the second-most distinctive component of the view. Sugarloaf Mountain is widely recognized as a major developed ski area and recreation resource. Viewers looking across the valley are able to see ski runs, major structures at

the base, communications towers on top of Sugarloaf Mountain, openings for the golf course, reflective roofs, the 115 kV transmission line that runs east-west through the valley, Sugarloaf Regional Airport, and patterns from timber harvesting on the north side of Route 27.

- Flagstaff Lake to the northeast. The highly configured shoreline of the lake, combined with the distant mountains in the background, creates a distinctive view that is partially filtered by foreground vegetation.
- Stewart Mountain to the east/southeast, including Poplar Mountain and the Long Falls Dam Road valley. This view is focused on Stewart Mountain and the V-shaped notch between it and Poplar Mountain where the turbines will be visible. Stewart is a lower, more rounded landform than either Sugarloaf or the Bigelow Range, with fewer pronounced mountains in the background. The most distinctive cultural feature on Stewart is the pattern resulting from recent timber harvesting that extend over most of the lower half of the west face. The other notable cultural feature is the 115 kV transmission line in the valley below the observer and over the north end of Stewart Mountain.


VIEWPOINT 9A (No view of Project)

Viewpoint A is located on the AT footpath at the base of a pronounced ledge on the south side of the AT, at a point where the trail makes a 90-degree turn. Hikers have to leave the trail and climb a 10±' rock ledge to get to the panoramic view at Viewpoint B. Photographs taken on 10/28/10 at 11:55am.

VIEWPOINT 9B (Highly filtered view of 8± turbines within 8 miles)

Viewpoint 9B is on a rock ledge adjacent to the AT (see two photographs on previous page). Three major focal points dominate the view from this location: Avery Peak and the other high peaks of the Bigelow Range to the west; Sugarloaf Mountain to the southwest; and Flagstaff Lake to the north.

Views toward the Project would be highly filtered by intervening vegetation. The turbines would not be seen in the views looking north.

Continued panoramic view looking west. Two distinct focal points are visible: the high peaks of the Bigelow Range on the right and Sugarloaf Mountain on the left. The existing 115 kV transmission line is distinctly visible as a straight line in the broad valley between the two mountain ranges. There would be no views of the Project from this direction.



VIEWPOINT 9B: Normal view photosimulation of Project as seen from Viewpoint 9B. While the computer model indicates that up to 8 turbines within 8 miles may be visible from this viewpoint, dense vegetation in the immediate foreground will screen the view of all but 3 – 4 of them. Hold image approximately 21" from eye to replicate actual view. If viewing on a computer screen, eye should be approximately 1.5 times the image width away from the screen. Photograph taken on 10/28/10 at 12:08pm. Lat: 45.129833°; Long: -70.210579°.

VIEWPOINT 9C (17 turbines visible within 8 miles.)





SEGMENT C. LEDGES BELOW LITTLE BIGELOW MOUNTAIN

The lower slopes of Little Bigelow Mountain, below Viewpoint 9, include a series of bald and partially wooded ledges (also known as the Blueberry Ledges) that afford periodic views to the north, east, and south. This segment of the trail has 11 viewpoints (Viewpoints 10 – 20) that afford both open, panoramic views and filtered, narrow views of the surrounding landscape. The Project would be visible in varying degrees from 6 of these views at distances of 4.67 miles to 5.04 miles to the closest turbine.


Viewpoint 10, adjacent to Viewpoint 9, offers a panoramic view of the eastern portion of Flagstaff Lake, starting at Blanchard Mountain on the west and continuing to the northern end of Stewart Mountain. Views include the highly configured shoreline of Flagstaff Lake, in addition to the diverse landforms in both the midground and background. The Project would not be highly visible from the panoramic view, where up to 17 turbines would be visible at the edge of the view. Turbines would be visible through a narrow opening in line with the AT.

Note: While the computer model indicates that up to 17 turbines within 8 miles may be visible, dense vegetation in the immediate foreground would prevent views of all but $9\pm$ turbines in most viewing areas.



VIEWPOINT 13

Description

This view is divided into two components: northeast toward Flagstaff Lake and the layered mountains in the background, and southeast toward Stewart and Poplar Mountains. The primary view is toward the northeast, which offers a more complex composition of landforms and water, and fewer recent cultural modifications. This viewpoint extends for approximately 250 feet, within which there will be a filtered view of the Project for approximately 65 feet in the middle section.



VIEWPOINT 14

(Filtered view of 17 turbines within 8 miles)

Description

Viewpoint 14 is comprised of three separate components. The upper portion is open and oriented northeast toward the southeasterly end of Flagstaff Lake, with its highly configured shoreline and occasional wooded islands. The view from the middle component is somewhat filtered. The view from the lower component extends from Stewart Mountain on the southeast to Flagstaff Lake on the northeast. The wide ledge invites hikers to stop.

VIEWPOINT 16

(View of 16 turbines within 8 miles)

Description

Viewpoint 16 is composed of three separate components. The upper viewing area has the widest panorama, but it is heavily filtered. The main viewpoint is in the middle, where the view extends from the southeastern end of Flagstaff Lake to Poplar Mountain and includes all of Stewart Mountain and a portion of Witham Mountain, plus a small pond at the base of Little Bigelow Mountain. The lower viewpoint is also heavily filtered, with views to Stewart Mountain.

The Project would not be visible from the upper viewpoint due to foreground vegetation. The middle view is composed of two separate components: a view to the northeast toward Flagstaff Lake and Roundtop Mountain, and a view to the southeast toward Stewart Mountain and Poplar Mountain. The Project would be seen on the right side of Stewart Mountain over an arc of 10°. At the lower viewpoint the Project would be seen at the edge of the view, to the right of Stewart Mountain, and partially filtered.








