- 1) Research, inventory, record keeping, and re-establishment of public rights to resolve ownership claims and boundaries
- 2) Research and records for municipal tax maps
- 3) Fund, establish, public access ways for trails and public access improvements

Funded projects have been implemented by one or more of the following types of participants:

- 1) Local committee or person, town historian, Conservation Commission, Access committee
- 2) Hired consultants, including attorneys, surveyors
- 3) Volunteer, contributed professional services
- 4) Town attorney
- 5) Town staff

### Outcome(s) of Project

Projects funded by the Grants may result in one or more of the following outcomes:

- 1) Court case, with court resolution, legal opinion, agreement
- 2) Mutual agreement, town signage
- 3) Improvements to trails and public access
- 4) Acquisition, using local, state, and/or federal funds
