Addendum to the Upper Kennebec Region Management Plan

The Plan text is modified as indicated in italics below to correct inadvertent omissions.

1) First paragraph on page 20, part of the subsection addressing the Character of the Land Base on the Holeb Unit:

The last major addition to the Unit was the 4,511-acre No. 5 Bog acquisition in 2009, which also included 85 acres on the Moose River near Holeb Falls in T5 R7. *TNC holds a perpetual conservation easement on the parcels, which specifies permitted and prohibited activities, and conducts monitoring annually. Permitted activities include environmental education, scientific research, non-motorized recreation, and construction and maintenance of trails and primitive campsites. Prohibited activities include timber harvesting, structures, and new roads or motorized trails. Additional details on permitted and prohibited activities are available in the easement document (see Appendix B). Much of the No. 5 Bog property is classified as wetland; about one-third is forest.*

2) Second paragraph on page 32, part of the subsection addressing Timber Resources on the eastern portion of the Holeb Unit:

(The No. 5 Bog tract in T5 R7 and Bradstreet Townships was gifted to the State as an Ecological Reserve. Though it holds several hundred upland forest acres and considerable forested wetland, these will not be managed for timber. Any potential cutting of trees would be done within the constraints of the reserve designation *and the conservation easement*. Likewise, the north and south Attean Pond shorelands and the Moose River riparian parcel in Attean Twp. will not be managed for timber, given their character and recreation/aesthetic value.)
