

MAINE BOARD OF DENTAL PRACTICE
Application Checklist for Deep Sedation/General Anesthesia Permits

A Deep Sedation/General Anesthesia Permit is NON-TRANSFERABLE. A separate permit application must be submitted, approved and issued by the Board for each practice location prior to providing deep sedation and/or general anesthesia services. To qualify for a permit, an applicant must hold an active Maine dentist license and shall submit the following:

- Documentation of successful completion of an advanced education program accredited by the ADA Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA) that affords comprehensive and appropriate training necessary to administer and manage deep sedation or general anesthesia commensurate with the “ADA Sedation Guidelines” as outlined in Board Rule Chapter 14.
- Payment of total fees of \$850.00 (application fee \$100.00; permit fee \$750.00)
- Copy of current, valid life support certifications (BLS, ACLS, and PALS - required for pediatric sedation)
- Completed, signed Deep Sedation/General Anesthesia Certification form that attests to adhering to the equipment, personnel, procedures, techniques and documents as outlined in the “ADA Sedation Guidelines” and requirements of Board Rule, Chapter 14:

Other information that will need to be provided as part of the online application:

- Dental personnel information: Pursuant to Board Rule Chapter 14 Section V(H)(2)(b) the operating dentist and at least two other individuals, one of whom is experienced in patient monitoring and documentation, and trained to handle emergency situations must be present. To that end, you will be asked to identify and attest to the following information:
 - Name and title of dental personnel;
 - License type and license number of each dental personnel, as applicable;
 - BLS certification information of dental personnel, including expiration date; and
 - Attest that at least one other individual is experienced in patient monitoring and documentation, and trained to handle emergency situations will be present.
