I. DEPARTMENTAL

A. COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS:

Appointments: Commissioner Brown announced that all the Department's Senior Management positions have been filled. Mr. Brown introduced Samantha Depoy-Warren as the Director of Education and Outreach, noting her writing experience as an asset to the Department in her role as the Department's press person. Additionally, Teco Brown was appointed to lead the Bureau of Land and Water Quality. Teco worked for the DEP years ago evaluating permit applications and working in the field. Julie Churchill was appointed to head the Department's Small Business and Assistance Office. Ms. Churchill will focus on helping business navigate the regulatory landscape. Barbara Parker is Acting Director for the Bureau of Remediation and Waste Management. An announcement of the final appointment for this position will be made in the near future.

1. STATE PLANNING OFFICE – JUNIPER RIDGE LANDFILL SOLID WASTE MINOR REVISION / DEPARTMENT ORDER #S-0020700-WD-W-M (appeal submitted by The Municipal Review Committee, Inc. and Penobscot Energy Recovery Company, LP)

The Board voted (8-0-0-2) on a motion to deny the appeal and request for public hearing submitted by the Municipal Review Committee, Inc. and the Penobscot Energy Recovery Company, LP. The vote affirms the Commissioner's decision contained in Department Order S-020700-WD-W-M which modified the permit regarding the use of municipal solid waste bypass from Maine Energy as a protective soft layer in landfill cells at Juniper Ridge. The Board Order approved includes corrections of minor typographical errors and the inclusion of language identified as Section 8(l) that was inadvertently omitted from the draft Board Order. The decision also modifies Finding of Fact #3 in the Department's Order S-0020700-WD-W-M by clarifying that MSW bypass from all 4 Maine incinerators may be used for the soft layer. Lastly the Board Order finds that a public hearing is not necessary to understand the evidence presented in the appeal.

The vote was taken pursuant to 38 M.R.S.A. §§ 1301 to 1310 –Y, and 06-096 CMR Chapter 2 Rules Concerning the Processing of Application and Other Administrative Matters, Chapter 400 Solid Waste Management Rules: General Provisions, and Chapter 401 Solid Waste Management Rules: Landfill Siting, Design and Operation.
