Ms. Churchill, Ms. McCarthy and Mr. Bird,

I believe the draft licenses that the Maine DEP has issued for the Fiberight/MRC solid waste processing facilities do not comply with state or federal law, particularly with respect to the Non-Hazardous Secondary Materials issue for the residue (PHS) to be burned from the Sugar Hydrolysis Process, with which I have first hand experience with from my former employer - Red Shield Acquisitio, dba Old Town Fuel and Fiber.

Based on the information for the permits and the supplemental documents that are part of the record, I therefore conclude that both the Air Emissions License and the Solid Waste License applications should be denied.

A public hearing on all of the Fiberight applications is requested to address these and other technical issues raised in the attached document and a second one to follow later this afternoon (before the 5 PM deadline) that focuses more on the Solid Waste License findings.
