After reviewing the project file which includes the application with its supportive data, agency review comments, staff summary and other related materials on file with regard to the above noted project, under provisions of Title 38, M.R.S.A., Sec. 483 and 1304, the Department finds the following facts:

1. The applicant has submitted evidence concerning compliance with Conditions #3 and #4 of the Order of the Board of Environmental Protection dated September 8, 1982. The nature of the evidence is:

A Phase II operational manual and results of construction performance testing.

2. Conditions #3 and #4 read as follows:

3. "No sludge shall be deposited in Phase II until all proposed 1982 Phase II construction is completed, and until detail for Phase II operation is submitted by the applicant to the Department for review and receives approval from the Commissioner."

4. "Results of all materials testing and performance testing as provided in construction specifications will be certified by applicant's engineer and reported to DEP."

BASED upon the above Findings, the Department concludes that STATLER INDUSTRIES INCORPORATED has complied with Conditions #3 and #4 of the Order for Augusta Paper Mill Sludge Disposal Site dated September 8, 1982 provided:

1. A gradation analysis of intermediate and final cover material for Phase I and Phase II is submitted to the Department for review and approval by the Commissioner prior to placement.
2. Plans for berms and ditches to control surface water runoff in Phase I are submitted to the Department for review and approval by the Commissioner prior to construction.
3. The uncontaminated runoff diverted from closed out portions of Phase I shall be sampled as part of the monitoring program. Parameters and sampling frequency shall be the same as for surface water sampling points.
