Photograph 5: View looking southeast to south from the lower south trail lookout (#1) on Moxie Mountain in Caratunk. Heald Ponds are visible to the southeast. The existing Bingham Wind Project turbines are visible approximately 10.2 to 11.8 miles from this viewpoint. The northernmost Moscow U.S. Air Force Radar Station Field is visible to the southeast at a distance of 2.1 miles. The proposed Project would be visible looking over this field approximately 5.0 miles from this viewpoint. The closest visible portion of the proposed Project would potentially be visible at a distance of 4.0 miles to the southeast from this viewpoint.



Photograph 6: View looking east to southeast from the middle south trail lookout (#2) on Moxie Mountain in Caratunk. Heald Ponds are visible to the southeast. The existing Bingham Wind Project turbines are visible approximately 10.3 to 11.9 miles from this viewpoint. The northernmost Moscow U.S. Air Force Radar Station Field is visible to the southeast at a distance of 2.2 miles. The proposed Project would be located 1.8 miles beyond (south) the most visible radar station field, 5.1 miles from this viewpoint. The closest visible portion of the proposed Project would potentially be visible at a distance of 4.1 miles to the east from this viewpoint.





Photograph 7: View looking southeast to south from the highest south trail lookout (#3) on Moxie Mountain in Caratunk. Heald Ponds are visible to the southeast. The existing Bingham Wind Project turbines are visible approximately 10.4 to 12 miles from this viewpoint. The northernmost Moscow United States Air Force radar station field is visible to the southeast at a distance of 2.2 miles. The proposed Project would be located 1.8 miles beyond (south) the most visible radar station field, 5.1 miles from this viewpoint. The closest visible portion of the proposed Project would potentially be visible at a distance of 4.2 miles to the southeast from this viewpoint.



Photograph 8: View looking south to southwest from the highest (#3) south trail lookout on Moxie Mountain in Caratunk. Robinson Pond and Doughnut Pond are visible to the southeast. The proposed Project will not be visible looking in this direction.

Robinson Pond, Doughnut Pond, and Chase Bog are visible to the south. The northernmost Moscow United States Air Force radar station field is visible to the southeast at a distance of 2.3 miles. The proposed Project would be located 1.8 miles beyond (south) the most visible radar station field, 5.2 miles from this viewpoint. The closest visible portion of the proposed Project would potentially be visible at a distance of 4.5 miles to the southeast from this viewpoint.

The proposed Project would be located 1.8 miles beyond (south) the most visible radar station field, 5.2 miles from this viewpoint. The closest visible portion of the proposed Project would potentially be visible at a distance of 5.0 miles from this viewpoint looking southeast to south.
