Comments: I am the owner of a camp on Hopkins Pond in Mariaville. Hopkins Pond is classified with a 1A rating in the study of "Maine's Finest Lakes". Lakes eligible for classification as a lA resource are of statewide significance and are recognized in DEP's own criteria for impact assessment. Hopkins Pond is a dramatic and pristine location, visually as well as environmentally. This area is special particularly because it is located close to Bangor, Ellsworth, and other population spots and yet it remains pristine and accessible. The current Pisgah Mountain towers are not visible from Hopkins Pond. The increased height of the proposed Silver Maple wind towers will add a significant change to the region due to the visual impact of these wind towers. I believe the height of these proposed towers will adversely impact the scenic resources surrounding Hopkins Pond and other nearby ponds, both because of the expansive view of the towers and more importantly, the blinking lights atop the towers. I would like to see a more complete and careful visual impact assessment simulation added to the application to DEP, which should be widely circulated to those who live in the impacted area. Thank you.
