I am in favor of wind power, but not willy-nilly development of it.

Onesy-twosy small wind farms have problems with energy storage, transmission and potential environmental impacts, not to mention viewsite selection / public resistance (NIMBY), that make them impractical, uneconomic, and ultimately only of benefit to the developer who reaps the tax benefits. Instead, Massachusetts and others, have set forth policies to develop utility-scale projects, which even the powerful opponents of Cape Wind (such as the Kennedys and Koch brothers) now support.
