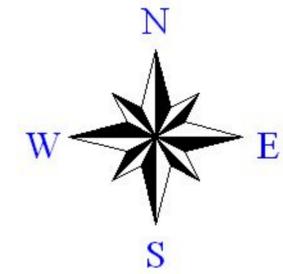



A-50-1 Biddeford Pool



Unless otherwise indicated, the boom length given is straight line distance as measured on the map. Actual length required will vary with conditions, and increase with current.

Strategy Implementation

1. Current is extremely fast at inlet mouth. Use current to assist deployment. Tow boom against current.
2. Attach 1200 feet of harbor boom from southern end of Hills Beach to Halftide Rock.
3. Attach 600 feet of intertidal boom and 400 feet of harbor boom from Vines Landing to Halftide Rock.
4. Secondary deployment, or if primary is not feasible: Deploy 2 sections of harbor boom across inlet inshore. Use as shallow an angle as possible due to high currents.
5. Observe deployment for stability.
6. Prepare to recover oil

Site Access	Route 9 to 208 east. Left turn at end of 208 onto Mile Stretch Road. Vine's Landing (public boat launch) is at end of Mile Stretch Rd.

Collection Points	East side of entrance to Biddeford Pool, southwest tip of Hills Beach	
Environmental Concerns	Biddeford Pool is an important bird wintering area. Shorebirds, marine worms and shellfish beds present. Roseate tern (endangered), harlequin duck (state threatened) and seabird nesting islands located just offshore of Wood Island Harbor.
