
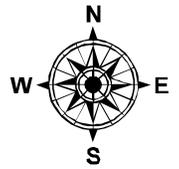



<b>Strategy Implementation</b>	Place 600' of harbor boom across channel at entrance to Salt Bay. Use two additional 500' lengths of intertidal boom at Oyster Creek and outlet of Damariscotta Lake as secondary protection.		
<b>Site Access</b>	Damariscotta Boat Ramp		
<b>Staging Areas</b>	Damariscotta Boat Ramp		
<b>Collection Points</b>	With skimmer or at cove on east side of channel. Land owned by Damariscotta River Association: 563-1393		
<b>Environmental Concerns</b>	Remnant American Oyster population. Extensive eelgrass. Diadromous fish and elver runs. Shorebird habitat.
