


Ducktrap Harbor Lincolnville





Strategy Implementation	<p>Frohock Brook: Use 150 feet of harbor boom to close off Frohock Brook on inland side of Route 1. Collect at adjacent restaurant parking lot. Ducktrap Harbor: Use 250 feet of harbor boom across ducktrap River at Howe Point. Collect from parking area at end of Howe Point Rd.</p>		
Site Access	From Route 1 in Lincolnville.		
Staging Areas	Restaurant parking lots adjacent to Frohock Brook on Route 1, parking area at end of Howe Point Road		
Collection Points	Adjacent parking areas.		
Environmental Concerns	Ducktrap River is designated habitat for endangered Atlantic Salmon. Contact U.S. Fish and Wildlife. Eelgrass, elver and diadromous fish runs in Ducktrap River. Diadromous fish run and salt marsh at Frohock Brook.
